Greetings, Everyone.

Jesus is Risen! He is Alive! The death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is the foundation on which our faith is built. It is a strong, solid foundation indeed. Because He lives, we can live.

"And you *He made alive*, who were dead in trespasses and sins." (Ephesians 2:1) But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in *His* kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast.
